The dogs and the dog shows, the travel, the thrills,

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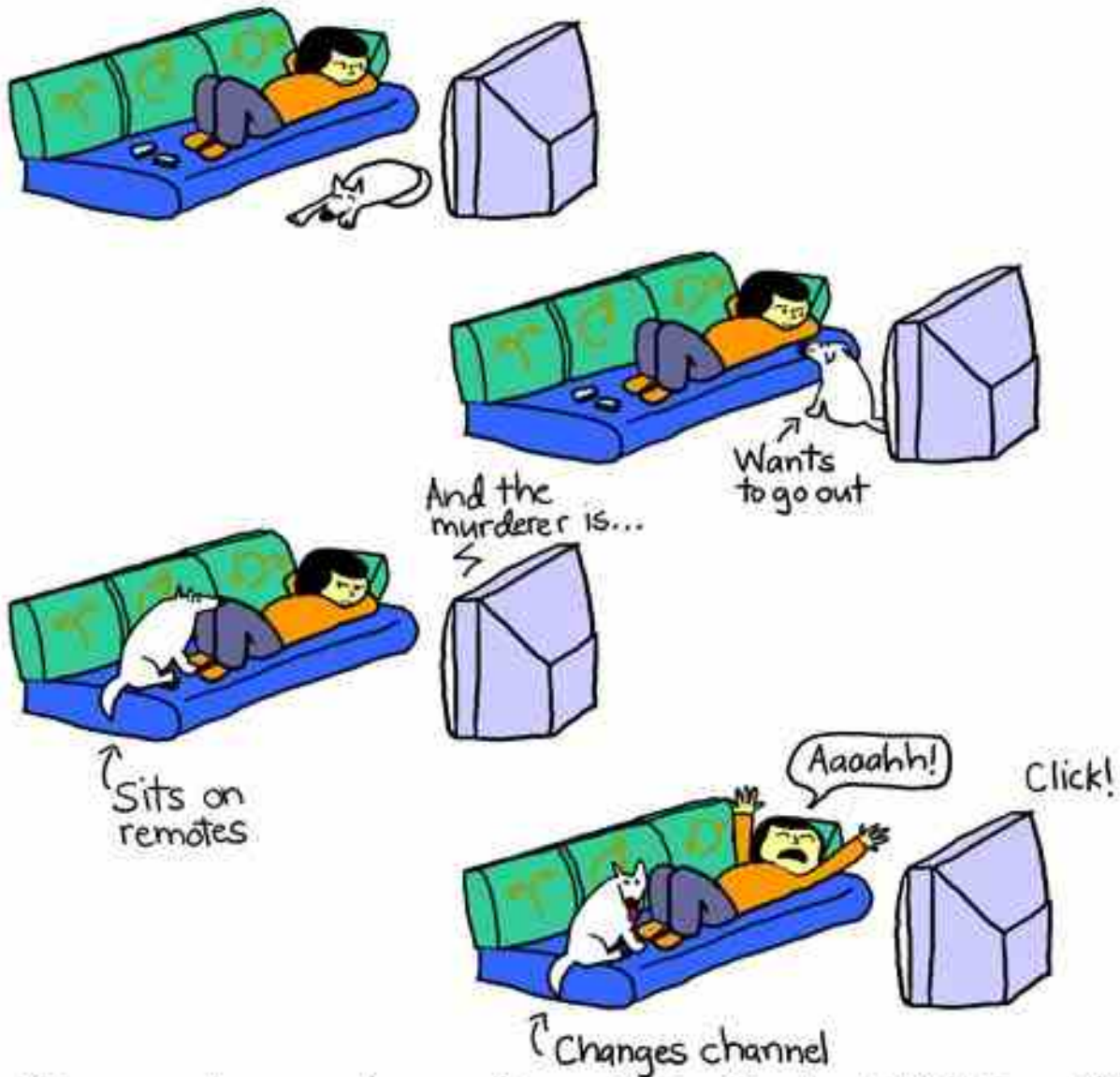
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The work and the worry, the pressure, the bills.

Hops	<i>Unknown compound causes panting, increased heart rate, elevated temperature, seizures, and death.</i>
Human vitamin supplements containing iron	<i>Can damage the lining of the digestive system and be toxic to the other organs including the liver and kidneys.</i>
Macadamia nuts	<i>Contain an unknown toxin, which can affect the digestive and nervous systems and muscle.</i>
Marijuana	<i>Can depress the nervous system, cause vomiting, and changes in the heart rate.</i>
Milk and other dairy products	<i>Some adult dogs and cats may develop diarrhoea if given large amounts of dairy products.</i>

Raw meat	<i>May contain bacteria such as Salmonella and E. coli, which can cause vomiting and diarrhoea.</i>
Rhubarb leaves	<i>Contain oxalates, which can affect the digestive, nervous, and urinary systems.</i>
Salt	<i>If eaten in large quantities it may lead to electrolyte imbalances.</i>
String	<i>Can become trapped in the digestive system; called a "string foreign body".</i>
Sugary foods	<i>Can lead to obesity, dental problems, and possibly diabetes mellitus.</i>

Table scraps (in large amounts)

*Table scraps are not nutritionally balanced. They should never be more than 10% of the diet. Fat should be trimmed from meat; bones should not be fed.*

Tobacco

## Food Allergies in Dogs

Research by **Dr. Alfred Plecher ( Plecher Alfred, J DVM and Martin Zucker, Pet Allergies Remedies for an Epidemic. Ingleswood, Ca: Very healthy enterprises 1986)** proved that the following foods **can** have allergic reaction in some dogs.

**The under mentioned foods are listed from the most allergent to the least.**

1. Red Meat
2. Milk *ó More than 80% of all dogs is allergic to milk. Dogs do not have the necessary enzymes to handle the Lactose in milk*
3. Brewer's yeast
4. Maize *ó vomiting and itching can occur*
5. Pork
6. Turkey
7. Eggs *ó Dogs may never get raw eggs. The white of the egg contains a protein Avidin that causes a biotin shortage that affects the absorption of this vital vitamin*
8. Fish
9. Wheat *ó also causes vomiting and skin irritations*

Numbers **1, 2** and **9** are responsible for **68%** of all skin allergies in dogs.

## Bones and Raw food Diet – Is it the healthiest choice for Dogs?

Fresh wholesome foods sound like a wonderful thing to feed our pets, and many dogs appear to do well on these diets, but are there hidden risks? If feeding bones and raw foods is your choice for feeding your dog, you should be aware of the potential problems as well as the benefits of these diets.

### What are the benefits?

By choosing the foods to feed, you are in control of the ingredients fed to your dog. There are not likely to be preservatives or additives if you are feeding organic foods. Some people enjoy preparing foods for their pets – indeed, we have dogs come into our clinic that are fed more expensive diets than most of our staff can afford!

Do be aware that there are a lot of false stories about the ingredients of commercial pet foods. They do not contain dead animals! They may contain 'offal', or the guts of animals, although this is what wild animals will eat. They do contain antioxidant preservatives to prevent them from becoming rancid. Some of them also contain textured vegetable proteins that appear to be meat and are not, some of them do contain colourings to make them appear more appealing. These are the same colourings added to processed human foods, and must be generally considered safe, although each of us must decide if we want to eat them or feed them to our dogs.

### Is it a balanced diet?

The feeding program for some of the raw food diets is meant to balance the diet over a couple of weeks, rather than for each meal. This is similar to the way many of us feed ourselves and our families, and with the right blend of ingredients this can work: however, in years as a veterinary nutritionist I have checked many homemade diet recipes and programs and none of them were balanced for essential nutrients. A nutritional study of the BARF diet published in 2001 showed the diet to be deficient in calcium, phosphorus, potassium and zinc, and excessively high in vitamin D. It is likely many adult dogs could cope with some of these calcium and phosphorus imbalances, but they may subtly affect the strength of the bones of growing dogs. Zinc deficiencies may cause skin disorders.

### It's natural but is it safe?

Several studies have looked at bacterial contamination of raw foods and shedding of bacterial in the faeces of dogs fed raw foods, and has shown that 20 – 30% of raw poultry test and 80% of raw food diets for dogs tested positive for *Salmonella* and 30% of stool samples from dogs were positive for *salmonella*. Raw food diets have also tested positive for *E coli* and *Yersinia enterocolitica* (bacteria that may cause gastrointestinal upset). Otherwise healthy dogs may be able to cope with ingestion of these bacteria, but very young, old, or immunocompromised dogs may not be able to do so. Further the stools contaminate the environment with these bacteria. Parasites that may be present in raw meat include *Toxoplasma gondii*, *Sarcocystis*, *Neospora caninum*, *Toxocara canis* (round worms) *Taenia* and *Echinococcus* (tape worms). When handling raw foods, either in preparation for human consumption or for the dog's dinner, the cook must be scrupulous in hygiene, washing all surfaces and hands before touching anything or anyone else. Small children, the elderly, and the immunocompromised (e.g. anyone ill or on immunosuppressive medicines) should not be handling the raw meat.

### Are raw bones safe?

Raw bones are usually added to the diet as a calcium source and for dental health. Chewing on a large meaty bone does seem a great source of joy for many dogs, and if it is large enough that it cannot be chewed up is generally considered safe. Analysis of the BARF diet has not confirmed that feeding bones is an adequate source of calcium. One of the major risks is that of bones becoming stuck in the oesophagus, stomach or intestines. There is a conception that feeding raw bones is safer than feeding cooked bones. While I know of no studies on this, it does seem more of the bones that I have removed from dogs' oesophagi have been cooked, there have certainly been raw ones as well. Bones that become stuck in the stomach, more likely in the intestine, may perforate the gut causing a potentially fatal peritonitis or abdominal infection. The only way to remove a bone stuck in the intestine is by surgery. Sometimes a segment of the intestine may need to be removed as well if the bone has damaged it.

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### **What happens when a bone gets stuck in a dogs Oesophagus?**

The first thing that you will probably see is your dog gagging and choking. He may start to salivate and make swallowing or gulping motions. If you see this, phone your veterinary surgeon and arrange to take your dog in immediately. Your veterinary surgeon will likely take an X- ray of your dogs neck and chest to see if they can see that there is indeed a bone stuck and where it is located. Many of these bones stick in the thoracic esophagus in the chest: often located right over the heart. Removing bones stuck in the oesophagus often a difficult procedure and is likely to require instrumentation and skills that are offered only at specialist referral practices. If your veterinary surgeon confirms that there is a bone stuck in your dogs Oesophagus, he or she should arrange an immediate referral to a specialist center. We always see these cases as urgent emergencies. The longer the bone is in the oesophagus, the more damage it can do. Sharp pieces can tear the oesophagus, allowing fluid from the oesophagus to enter the chest where it can cause a fatal infection. Even if there are no sharp edges, the pressure from the bone will eventually erode the oesophagus so that it falls apart, again causing a potential fatal infection. If the oesophagus does fall apart or is torn badly, it often cannot be mended surgically and the dog must sadly be put to sleep.

### **What happens when you get to the specialist center?**

If you come to the hospital for small animals in Edinburgh University during working hours a specialist in internal medicine will usually see you soon after arriving. If you arrive after hours, you will most likely be seen by a house officer who will arrange to have a specialist come into the clinic to take care of your dog. The person seeing you and your dog will gather some history about what has happened and when, and also some background history to allow us to take the best possible care of your dog. Your dog will then be admitted to the hospital. Depending on the individual circumstances, generally your dog will have another X- ray to confirm the current location of the bone. He will be anaesthetized and an endoscope (a long, flexible tube with a camera on the end) will be passed into the oesophagus to determine the shape of the bone to aid in removal and access the state of the oesophagus. Very occasionally the bone is pushed into the stomach instead of removing it out of the mouth. It takes considerable experience to know how much pressure to use to pull out the bone – if excessive force is used the oesophagus can be damaged even more. Once the bone has been removed, the internist checks the oesophagus again with the endoscope to check how much damage occurred where the bone was located. In some cases another x-ray is taken to look for leakage into the chest. If the bone absolutely cannot be removed or pushed into the stomach, surgery will be necessary to remove it. If the bone is stuck in the oesophagus where the oesophagus passes through the chest, this will mean opening up the dogs chest – a major and painful operation.

In the majority of dogs we are successful in removing the bones, and if they have not been present to long, the oesophagus heals successfully with the use of medications. If there is extensive damage, a feeding tube may be placed directly into the dogs stomach from his side to bypass the oesophagus while it heals. This can usually be removed within a couple of weeks. A possible after effect in dogs with extensive oesophagus damage is an oesophageal stricture, where the scaring in the oesophagus causes it to narrow. If the narrowing creates to small a diameter, the dog may not be able to swallow, and will regurgitate his meals. A procedure involving repeatedly anaesthetizing the dog and attempting to stretch the stricture is used in these cases, with varying success.

In summary, if you choose to feed the BARF diet or any other diet involving raw foods, we recommend that very special hygienic care is used in handling the food and the dogs faeces. Remember to deworm your dog regularly, and tell your veterinary surgeon what diet you are feeding so that if your dog develops gastrointestinal disorders they will know to look for the bacteria and parasites mentioned above. Ideally the diet should be balanced by a veterinary nutritionist and supplemented as necessary.

If you feed bones, either raw or cooked, that can be ingested by your dog, you are running the risk of oesophagus or gastrointestinal obstructions. It may be possible to chop or grind the bone up small enough (e.g. less than 0,5cm) that they are less likely to get stuck. Alternatively, consider consulting a veterinary nutritionist to determine the amount of calcium (and possibly other nutrients) to add to his diet and skip the bones.

## Coccidiosis Causing Diarrhoea, Runny and Bloody Stools

Before I start, I have to stress that I am not a vet, but I have learnt through 36 years of breeding and showing of dogs.

The above condition is caused by parasites, NOT the wormy kind! Of course, have your dog dewormed FIRST, but these guys don't die from deworming tablets! They are called coccidia and the condition is called coccidiosis. Almost all dogs are carriers of coccidia, but the strains might be weaker or being kept in check by the dog's immune system.

They are microscopically small and could burrow into the dog's intestinal wall or muscles. They could even burrow into the nervous system, causing muscle tremors! They thrive by covering the whole intestinal wall, making digestion very difficult. Little can be absorbed and enzymes can't be released. The undigested food thus passes down the intestinal tract too far, causing diarrhoea.

If you take your dog to the vet, they will take X-rays to check for obstructions, but won't find any. They will give him antibiotics, which won't work. Then, they will do a colonoscopy and check stool samples. The problem with coccidia is that they are not detectable in each stool sample and the lab needs to go through the WHOLE stool, each stool for a few days. The results might come back negative the one-day and positive the next. This is a very costly exercise and most people won't even go this route. It will cost you thousands of Rands to find out that they have these parasites!

Don't leave your dog untreated for too long as permanent damage may occur or even quick death.

### Treatment

If you need to read more about coccidia and giardia, [www.beaglesunlimited.com](http://www.beaglesunlimited.com) is a good source of information, but the American medicines are not all available here.

Disinfect the area where the dog is kept with bleach or swimming pool chlorine.

Coccidia can be killed by *Diameton*. This is available from your local chemist. You can also use *sulfadimethoxine* medication for pigeons (Medicox made by MedPet). Mix a knife point *Diameton* powder with 5 ml water and squirt into your dog's mouth. Repeat daily until the bloody stool stops. A dosage of 55mg (*sulfadimethoxine*)/ kg bodyweight can also be used as a shock treatment first dosage and then half that, 27.5mg/ kg. Administer twice daily for 10 days. Tests have shown that dogs given 160mg/ kg of bodyweight didn't show any signs of toxicity, maybe only slight diarrhoea. You thus don't need to worry about overdosing. The Medicox powder has about the same weight to volume ratio as water. A level teaspoon would thus be about 5g of Medicox, which contains 1.25g *sulfadimethoxine*. This would be sufficient for a 45.5kg dog. For small dogs of let's say 5kg, you would need 550mg of Medicox (137.5mg *sulfadimethoxine*). This would be very hard to measure! Take a level teaspoon (5g) and mix with 200ml water. Take 4.5 teaspoons of this mixture and mix with your dog's food.

The other parasite, which causes exactly the same symptoms, is called giardia. It is recommended that you doctor for coccidia first. If it doesn't work, your dog most probably has giardia. Then treat your dog for 5 days with *Metronidazole*, which is also an active ingredient of similar medications.

Head long, strong and deep right to end of muzzle, but not coarse. Viewed from front egg-shaped and completely filled, its surface free from hollows or indentations. Top of skull almost flat from ear to ear. Profile curves gently downwards from top of skull to tip of nose which should be black and bent downwards at tip. Nostrils well developed and under-jaw deep and strong.

#### EYES

Appearing narrow and triangular, obliquely placed, black or as dark brown as possible so as to appear almost black, and with a piercing glint. Distance from top of nose to eyes perceptibly greater than that from eyes to top of skull. Blue or partly blue undesirable.

#### EARS

Small, thin and placed close together. Dog should be able to hold them stiffly erect, when they point straight upwards.

#### MOUTH

Teeth sound, clean, strong, of good size, regular with perfect, regular and complete scissor bite, i.e. upper teeth closely overlapping lower teeth and set square to the jaws. Lips clean and tight.

#### NECK

Very muscular, long, arched, tapering from shoulders to head and free from loose skin.

#### FOREQUARTERS

Shoulders strong and muscular without loading. Shoulder blades wide, flat and held closely to chest wall and have a very pronounced backward slope of front edge from bottom to top, forming almost a right angle with upper arm. Elbows held straight and strong, pasterns upright. Forelegs have strongest type of round, quality bone, dog should stand solidly upon them and they should be perfectly parallel. In mature dogs length of foreleg should be approximately equal to depth of chest.

#### BODY

Body well rounded with marked spring of rib and great depth from withers to brisket, so that latter nearer ground than belly. Back short, strong and backline behind withers level, arching or roaching slightly over broad, well muscled loins. Underline from brisket to belly forms a graceful upward curve. Chest broad when viewed from front.

**HINDQUARTERS**

Hindlegs in parallel when viewed from behind. Thighs muscular and second thighs well developed. Stifle joint well bent and hock well angulated with bone to foot short and strong.

**FEET**

Round and compact with well arched toes.

**TAIL**

Short, set on low and carried horizontally. Thick at root, it tapers to a fine point.

**GAIT/MOVEMENT**

When moving appears well knit, smoothly covering ground with free, easy strides and with a typical jaunty air. When trotting, movement parallel, front and back, only converging towards a centre line at faster speeds, forelegs reaching out well and hind legs moving smoothly at hip, flexing well at stifle and hock, with great thrust.

**COAT**

Short, flat, even and harsh to touch with a fine gloss. Skin fitting dog tightly. A soft textured undercoat may be present in winter.

**COLOUR**

For White, pure white coat. Skin pigmentation and markings on head not to be penalised. For Coloured, colour predominates; all other things being equal, brindle preferred. Black, brindle, red, fawn and tricolour acceptable. Tick markings in white coat undesirable. Blue and liver highly undesirable.

**SIZE**

There are neither weight nor height limits, but there should be the impression of maximum substance for size of dog consistent with quality and sex.

**FAULTS**

Any departure from the foregoing points should be considered a fault and the seriousness with which the fault should be regarded should be in exact proportion to its degree and its effect on the health and welfare of the dog.

**NOTE**

Male animals should have two apparently normal testicles fully descended into the scrotum.

**BULL TERRIER [MINIATURE]**

The Standard of the Bull Terrier [Miniature] is the same as that of the Bull Terrier with the exception of the following:

**Size:** Height should not exceed 35.5cm [14ins]. There should be an impression of substance to size of dog. There is no weight limit. Dog should, at all times, be balanced.

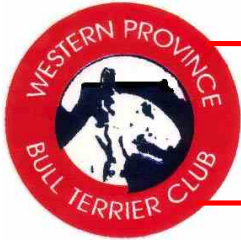
